New Philharmonic Orchestra of Irving Concert

May 23, 2006



The **New Philharmonic Orchestra of Irving** ends its eighteenth classical season with Conductor and Music Director Richard Giangiulio on **May 23rd** at the **Irving Arts Center**. The Tuesday night **8 pm** concert opener is the dramatic and picturesque *Le Chasseur Maudit*, Cesar Franck's depiction of "The Wild Huntsman". Mozart's beautiful Concerto for Two Pianos features Lucille Chung and Alessio Bax. Both artists have performed extensively throughout the world and NPOI audiences may remember hearing Bax a few years ago. In this concerto, likely written to perform with his sister Nannerl, Mozart displays all of his usual charm, grace and wit with virtuosity. The season closes with Modeste Mussorgsky's *Pictures at an Exhibition*, written as a tribute to his close friend, architect and occasional painter Victor Hartmann. Mussorgsky's visit to an exhibition of Hartmann's works provided him inspiration for the pieces, originally for piano and later masterfully orchestrated by Maurice Ravel.

This concert will be an important one in the life of the Philharmonic, as Richard Giangiulio steps down as conductor and music director. The 2006-2007 concert season will feature five guest conductors.

Included in the ticket price are the popular 7 pm Pre-concert Recital Series in Carpenter Hall. This evening's program will feature the staff of the Irving ISD Fine Arts Department.

Ticket prices are affordably priced at \$15, \$10 and \$8.

ARTS ACTION ALERT

Take Action Now!

May 12, 2006

The U.S. House of Representatives is scheduled to begin floor consideration of the FY 2007 Interior Appropriations bill on Thursday, May 18. Funding for the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) and National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) is provided through this bill. We ask that you take just two minutes to [contact your Congressperson](#) and ask them to vote for a bipartisan Congressional Arts Caucus floor amendment to increase NEA funding for 2007. With a few clicks, you can send a customizable message to your Congressperson, including the reasons you believe arts funding is important. We need this amendment to pass because the bill under consideration does not provide any increase to the NEA's current funding level of \$124 million. The amendment would provide an increase of between of \$5 million and \$7.5 million for the NEA, and an equal increase to the NEH. These increases would allow both agencies' grant programs to keep up with inflation, and improve their level of service to the American people.

The Congressional Arts Caucus has offered a similar amendment each of the past six years. Those amendments were successfully passed in large part because of the efforts of passionate arts advocates like you. We need you again this year to contact your Representative as soon as possible because Members of Congress are more likely to vote for this amendment if they hear directly from their constituents.

We've made it very easy for you to send a quick and customized electronic message to your Representative by using [Americans for the Arts' E-Advocacy Center](#). By simply entering your zipcode you'll be able to send a message to your Member urging them to vote *for* the amendment to increase funding for the NEA, and *against* any possible attempt to decrease it. We've also provided convenient talking points to help you make your case.

The Mission: The CAN organization was created for the purpose of helping cooperative member arts organizations build audiences by supporting each other. CAN will send notifications to list members with news of member organizations' upcoming events and other arts news of interest.

The Rules:

- 1) Since this is a "cooperative" of arts organizations supporting each other, member groups who would like to post notices, agree to "receive" notifications from other member groups in return. Individuals will have the option at any time to "opt-out" if they choose not to receive future notifications by e-mailing the list manager.
 - 2) In order to preserve the integrity and quality of the postings to this list and to prevent any unwanted "Spamming", all notifications that member groups want to send through this notification list must come through the list manager. Groups simply send an e-mail notification to the list manager with a descriptive write-up and it will be sent. If there are multiple notifications that need to go out, they may be grouped together in "digest" format to reduce the number of e-mails that are sent to the list.
- If at anytime, you would like to be removed from this e-mail list or if you are a new organization that would like to join, please e-mail the list manager and your request will be acted upon in a timely manner.
